SYNOPSIS

PART ONE:

Lucian and his friends are advised by the Doctor to take a holiday. They sail in a ship but lose their bearings and arrive at an unknown Island. They find traces of a previous visit by Hercules and Dionysus, and witness a sad occurrence in a curious vineyard.

PART TWO:

A whirlwind carries the ship into the sky, where Lucian and his crew are arrested and taken to the moon, which is, of course, inhabited. They assist the King, Endymion, in a battle against the inhabitants of the sun, and afterwards learn of the unusual formation of their society.

PART THREE:

On regaining the Terrestrial Sea the ship and its crew is swallowed by a whale. Two survivors from a previous shipwreck are found inside the monster, and are rescued when the company eventually get their ship out again.

PART FOUR:

A beautiful Island turns out to be the abode of the blessed dead. Rhadamanthus, the Eternal Judge, permits the party to make a brief stay, provided they keep the peace. An attempted elopment by one of them with Helen of Troy results in a mutiny of the Damned, incarcerated on a neighbouring Island. The living Greeks, deemed to have broken the Peace are ordered to leave, and sail home refreshed. Their Doctor meanwhile, has died of overwork.
